

TRANSPORTATION PERMIT GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1) **REGISTRATION AND LICENSE PLATES** - All hauling units must be duly registered with the Department of Motor Vehicles as required by law, and that all Special Mobile Equipment must carry a valid identification plate.
- 2) **PROHIBITED MOVING HOURS** - Movement of oversize loads and/or vehicles shall be prohibited during the hours of darkness (1/2 hr. before sunrise and 1/2 hr. after sunset) unless otherwise indicated on the transportation permit and between the hours of 7:00AM to 9:00AM and 4:00PM to 6:00PM.
- 3) **VISIBILITY** - All moves shall be prohibited during hours of reduced visibility (less than 1,000 feet).
- 4) **HOLIDAYS AND WEEK ENDS** - No moves shall be permitted on Saturday, Sunday, New Years Day, Memorial Day, 4th of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day. Special permission may be granted to move during the above prohibited periods provided such moves are necessitated by emergencies or by other valid reasons and provided that such permission is cited on the permit or amendments thereto.
- 5) **SAFETY OF OTHER TRAFFIC** - The permittee shall at all times provide for the safety of the public when the vehicle under the permit disrupts the normal traffic pattern and flow within the traveled way. He shall provide flagmen, signs, warning lights, or other safety devices as necessary to give the public ample warning and to safely route the traffic through or around the congested area.
- 6) **ESCORTS** - Front escorts shall be required for loads or vehicles over 12 feet 6 inches in width and both front and rear escorts shall be required for loads over 14 feet in width.
- 7) **HEIGHT** - When an over-height (over 13 feet, 6 inches) is authorized, the permittee shall check all underpasses, bridges, overhead wires, and other limiting structures or facilities for adequate clearance.
- 8) **OVERHEAD POWER AND TELEPHONE CABLES** - The permittee shall notify the owners of all overhead lines or structures subject to disturbance or damage by his move and shall make arrangements for the temporary removal or relocation of the conflicting facility if required.
- 9) **EXCESSIVE HEIGHTS** - When the vertical height is 20 feet and over, no permit shall be issued until clearances have been received by the Fire Department, Power Company, and Telephone Company.
- 10) **CARE OF TREES** - No trees shall be cut, trimmed, or in any way damaged.
- 11) **STOPPING AT NIGHT** - No vehicle or load being moved shall be parked overnight on a city street, alley, or public property without permission being expressly given and so indicated on the permit.
- 12) **STALLED** - If an over-width load, because of emergency or breakdown, is forced to park on a city street, the permittee shall immediately notify the Police Department, the Fire Department, and the City Engineer, and shall take all necessary actions to effect the earliest possible removal from the street. He shall display such lights, flags, or other traffic warning devices as necessary for safety, and shall take all necessary precautions to protect the pavement from prolonged overloading.
- 13) **PROTECTION ON BRIDGES AND NARROW ROADS** - When crossing bridges or transporting on roads so narrow that there is insufficient room for traffic to travel in both directions with reasonable safety, flagmen shall be posted ahead of, and behind the equipment to warn and direct approaching traffic.
- 14) **RESPONSIBILITY FOR BRIDGES** - This permit does not authorize crossing of any posted bridges with gross load exceeding posted limits unless specifically mentioned on the face of this permit. Permittee shall comply with all rules posted on any bridges over which he shall pass and shall assume all risks relative thereto. When a power shovel or similar equipment is moved under its own power across bridges having asphalt type surface, running planks or heavy belting of sufficient width must be used under the tracks to protect the surface.
- 15) **PERMIT SUBJECT TO INSPECTION** - The permit must be carried on the equipment or structure at all times while it is being moved within the highway limits. The permit shall be submitted for inspection on demand of any law enforcement officer or any authorized agent of the city of El Cajon.
- 16) **LIABILITY FOR DAMAGE** - The permittee is responsible for all liability for personal injury or property damage which may occur through any act or omission of the permittee when acting under the terms of this permit, and in the event any claim is made against the City of El Cajon or any department, officer, or employee thereof, through, by reason of, or in connection with any such act or omission, the permittee shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless from such claim.
- 17) **KIND OF EQUIPMENT** - Buildings are to be moved with regular house moving equipment.
- 18) **CLEANING UP OF THE RIGHT-OF-WAY** - Upon completion of the transport, all timbers and equipment shall be removed, and the right-of-way left in the same condition as before the transport started.
- 19) **DO NOT DISTURB ROADWAY SURFACE** - No wedge, bar, or spike shall be driven in the surface of any dedicated public right-of-way.
