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Major Parking Lot Changes At City Hall Start Next Week!

Ledcor Construction is getting ready to begin Phase II of construction on the Public Safety Center in downtown El Cajon, which will bring some major changes.

Phase I activity included a sidewalk closure on the south side of Park Avenue and construction of two temporary parking lots so the contractor can close Civic Center Way and the existing City Hall parking lot. Once the former City Hall parking lot is fenced off and secured, demolition and excavation will begin in preparation for the construction of the Public Safety Center.

Effective Monday, August 3rd, the public will use Rea Avenue for access to City Hall and the Council Chambers with parking available in the new temporary lot built on the north side of Rea Avenue. The temporary parking lot constructed at Magnolia and Park Avenues is not available for general public use Monday through Friday from 6 a.m. – 6 p.m. **County and Court use is not permitted in either of these City parking lots.** Please be careful not to park in permit parking spaces. Vehicles not displaying the appropriate parking permits will be cited and/or towed.

When visiting the East County Regional Center and Superior Court House, two parking lots are available; one at 250 East Main Street and another between Park and Wells Avenue near the Rubios restaurant on Magnolia Avenue. The Rea Avenue parking lot is not available for County and Court business.

If you do not need to conduct business in person at City Hall, you may find it more convenient to use the mail or Internet for certain processes. **Please note that the mailing address for El Cajon City Hall changed from 200 E. Main Street to 200 Civic Center Way, El Cajon, California 92020.**
